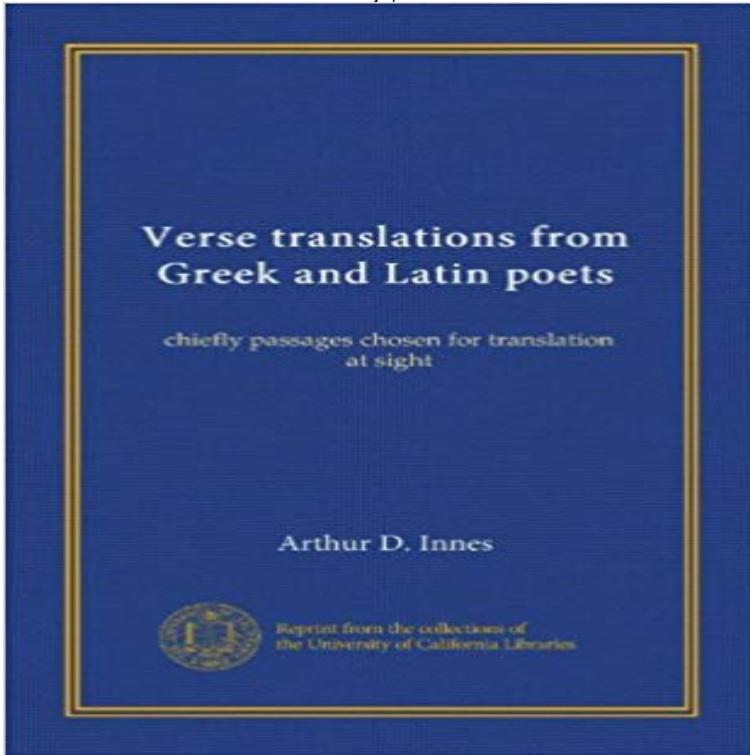


Verse translations from Greek and Latin poets: chiefly passages chosen for translation at sight
