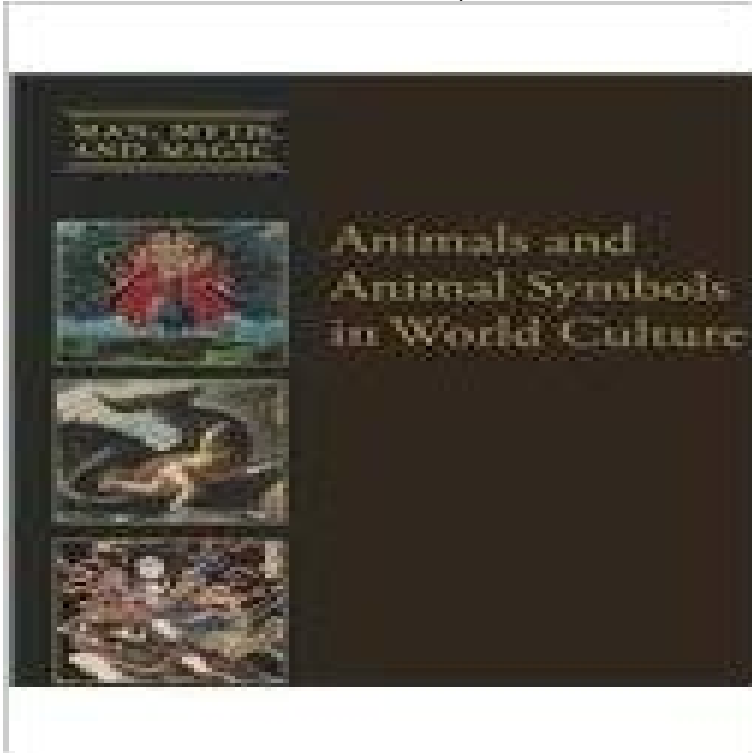


Animals and Animal Symbols in World Culture (Man, Myth & Magic)
