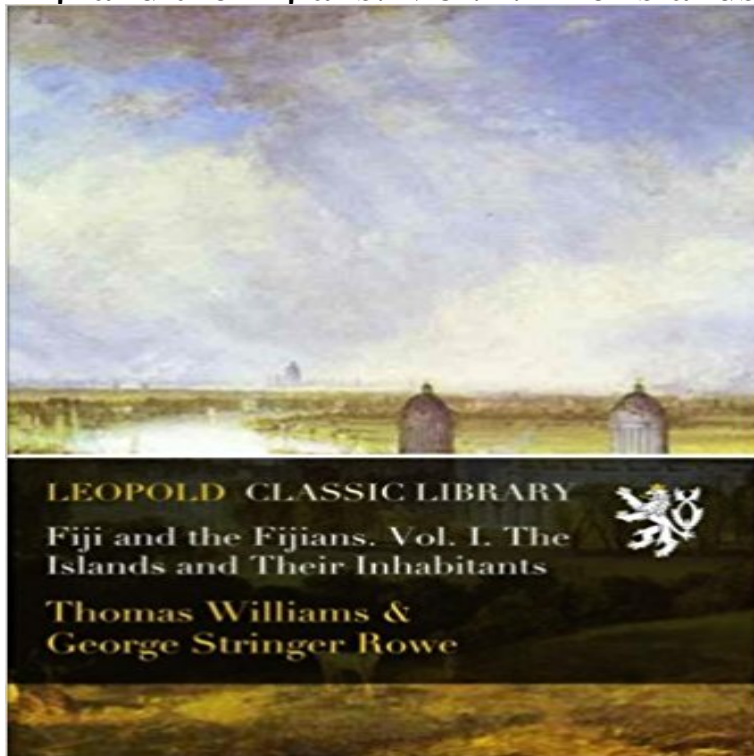


Fiji and the Fijians. Vol. I. The Islands and Their Inhabitants
