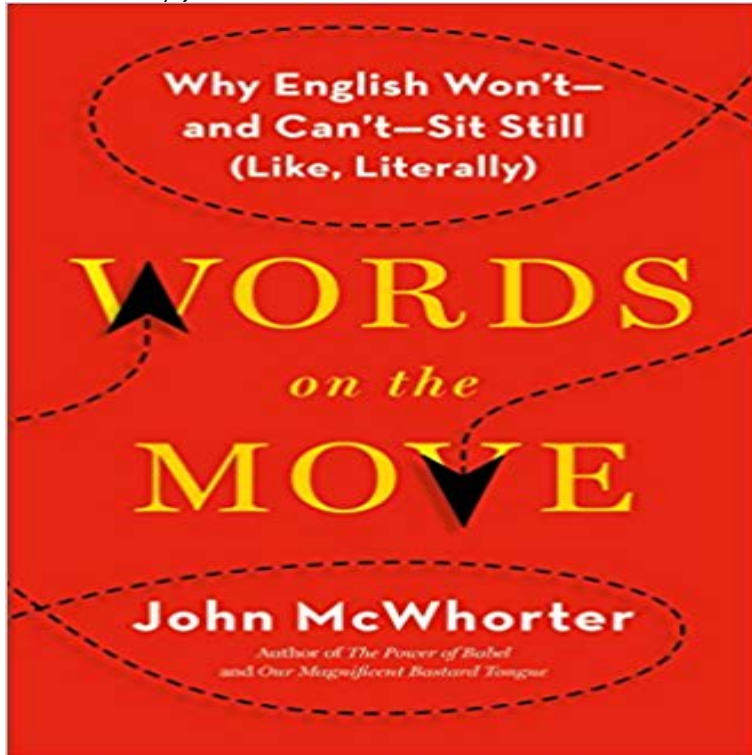


## Words on the Move: Why English Wont - and Cant - Sit Still (Like, Literally)
